Chaotic messages unfold

HE onslaught of communications and the way people choose to deal with them is the focus of a new dance production called *Aether*.

Scottish sound designer Gerald Mair has produced the score for the 50-minute work with costumes by Paula Levis and lighting by Keith Tucker.


