## Baryshnikov and French Innovator Win Bessie Awards

A Russian ballet star who has encouraged modern dance and an experimental French ballet choreographer were among the dance world figures honored on Wednesday night when Dance Theater Workshop presented its 13th annual New York Dance and Performance Awards at the Fiorello H. La Guardia High School of Music and Art and Performing Arts. The awards, familiarly known as the Bessies, are named

for Bessie Schönberg, a respected teacher of dance composition who died this year.

Mikhail Baryshnikov, the ballet star, received a special citation for establishing the White Oak Dance Project, a troupe that emphasizes contemporary choreography. Members of the company accepted the award for Mr. Baryshnikov, who was in Europe. A Choreographer/Creator Award went to Angelin Preljocaj, the French choreographer, for "Annonciation," which his Ballet Preljocaj danced at the Joyce Theater in April.

Special citations also went to Leo Janks, a technical director for many groups, and to Janet Stapleton and Richard Move, organizers of the "Martha at Mother" series of club performances.

Several choreographers and performance-art creators were honored for specific productions, others for sustained achievement. A gift from The Village Voice enabled each of them to receive an award of \$1,000. In addition to Mr. Preljocaj, the choreographers or artistic collaborators cited for specific productions included Doug Elkins ("The Stuff of Reing" and "Center My Heart"); san Marshall and Philip Glass ("Enfants Terribles"); Dianne M tyre and Olu Dara ("A Brand M People on the Planet"); Basil Tr ("The Araneidae Show"); Lucy Crin ("Two Lies"), and Sham Moss Ronald K. Gray and David Please ("Hybridium"). Mark Dendy honored for sustained achievem Jennifer Monson for both sustai achievement and "Sender."
