DANCE THEATER WORKSHOP AND DANSPACE PROJECT ANNOUNCE THE RECIPIENTS OF THE 1996-97 NEW YORK DANCE AND PERFORMANCE AWARDS (A.K.A. THE BESSIES).

On Wednesday evening, September 17, 1997, Dance Theater Workshop presented the Thirteenth Annual New York Dance and Performance Awards (a/k/a the BESSIES) for exceptional achievements of the 1996-97 season in an evening of performance and celebration at The La Guardia Concert Hall at the Fiorello H. La Guardia High School of Music and Art and Performing Arts. Originally established in 1985, the BESSIES acknowledge outstanding creative work by independent artists in the fields of dance and related performance in New York City. Over 1,000 artists, producers and press joined in the activities to honor the diversity of ideas that makes New York's contemporary performing arts community thrive.

The Masters of Ceremony for this event were performing artists Dan Froot, 1991 Bessie Recipient, and Lisa Kron, 1995 Bessie Recipient. The event included performances by musical guests Ancient Aborigines, the Doug Elkins Dance Company with an excerpt from *Center My Heart*, and choreographer/dancer Deborah Jowitt in her solo *Body (In) Print*.

This year's awards presentation included 23 citations honoring a total of 37 individuals for achievements during the 1996-97 season in the following categories: **Choreographer/Creator**, **Performer**, **Visual Designer**, **Composer** and **Special Citations**. As a whole, the award recipients represent a diverse cross-section of work created by independent artists in the performing arts community, including a wide range of works seen in smaller, alternative spaces to works produced by major venues. These artists represent a core that influences and develops the future of our cultural history. This year, *The Village Voice* readers voted cash awards for both creators (\$1,000/each) and performers (\$500/each).

This year's Performance Awards were given to **Gerald Casel** for Sustained Achievement with **Stephen Petrone, Zvi Gotheiner** and **Stanley Love**; **Tom Thayer** for Sustained Achievement with **David Dorfman, Claudia De Smet** and **Julie Bour** for their performances in **Angelin Preljocaj's Annonciation**; **Kimberly Bartosik** for Sustained Achievement with **Merce Cunningham**; **Sheri Williams** for Sustained Achievement with **Dayton Contemporary Dance Company**; and **Meredith Monk's Vocal Ensemble** including **Carlos Arevalo, Then Bleckmann, Thomas Bogdan, Janis Brenner, Allison Easter, Diana Emerson, Katie Geisslinger, Ching Gonzalez, Stephen Kalm** and **Randall Wong**, for their performances in *Politics of Quiet*.

Composer Awards went to **Zeena Parkins** for Jennifer Monson's *Sender*, and to **David Tudor** for Sustained Achievement with **Merce Cunningham** and *Ocean*; and to **Amy Denio** for David Dorfman's *Skydown*.

This year's Visual Design Awards were given to lighting designer **Margie Medlin** for Lucy Guerin's *Two Lies*; visual designer **Karin Walicka-Malmone** for Susan Marshall and Philip Glass's *Les Enfants Terribles*; and lighting designer **Philip Sandström** for David Dorfman's *Skydown*.

This year, Special Citations were given to **Leo Janks** for downtown technical and production support and to **Mikhail Baryshnikov** for the artistic direction of The White Oak Project.
