## Healthy hearts start with councils

GOOD heart health can start out in the community and the Heart Foundation is taking that message to councils.

Heart Foundation cardiovascular health director Wendy Keech made a presentation to the Port Lincoln City Council last month about the role it could play in improving the health of its citizens.

Ms Keech said keeping communities healthy was not just a job for the medical system, it was a broader responsibility for the whole community, starting at a planning level.

She encouraged the council to think about the design of the community and how it could encourage activity by planning for active living with walking paths, footpaths and access to public transport.

She said there was already a lot of good work happening in Port Lincoln like the Parnkalla Trail.

Councils could also look at making specific outdoor areas like playgrounds smokefree.

She also encouraged the council to think about signing up to the international charter Walk21 and implementing a healthy catering policy.

## Title will be considered

THE state government has responded to claims of possible compensation for marine park sanctuary zones in native title areas, saying rights and interests of indigenous Australians will be taken into account when developing the zones.

Environment and Conservation Minister Paul Caica said providing traditional use of resources to indigenous Australians such as traditional fishing within marine parks will be recognised.

"In developing a draft marine park management plan, Aboriginal heritage and the interests of the traditional owners of any land or other natural resources should be considered," Mr Caica said.

"In relation to a draft marine park management plan, the government must seek the views of a representative of all signatories to any Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) that is in force in any area within a marine park.

"The government must also seek the views of a representative of any native title holders or claimants that have a native title determination or registered native title claim."

Mr Caica said any prohibitions or restrictions applying within a marine park are subject to native title and native title rights and interests.

He also said one member of the marine parks council of South Australia must be knowledgeable of the marine environment in relation to indigenous culture.

There are six native title claims waiting to be determined that interact with proposed marine park sanctuary zones in South Australian waters.
